ADDC Convention Field Trip to the Natural Bridge Caverns




One of the 73rd ADDC Convention Field Trips was to the Natural Bridge Caverns located just outside of San Antonio, Texas, the Caverns are a stunning example of nature's underground artistry. As the largest commercial cave system in Texas, these caverns offer a unique glimpse into geological processes that have been shaping the Earth for thousands of years. From their discovery in the 1960s to their continued exploration today, the Natural Bridge Caverns remain a vital part of Texas history and natural heritage.

The Natural Bridge Caverns were discovered on March 27, 1960, by four college students from St. Mary's University. With permission from landowner Clara Wuest, the students explored a small opening on her ranch and uncovered a vast network of underground chambers. Recognizing the importance of the site, the Wuest family invested in its development, and the caverns officially opened to the public on July 3, 1964. A month later, Texas Governor John Connally dedicated the site as "A Jewel in the Crown of Texas Attractions." The caverns are considered a "living cave," meaning their formations are still actively growing. Rainwater seeps through the limestone, dissolving minerals and redepositing them as stalactites, stalagmites, and flowstones. The cave maintains a constant temperature of 70°F and nearly 100% humidity, which supports the ongoing development of these formations. One of the most impressive chambers is the Hall of the Mountain Kings, which is 350 feet long, 100 feet wide, and 100 feet high. Archaeological discoveries within the caverns include arrowheads, spearheads, and the jawbone of an extinct grizzly bear, indicating that early humans and animals once used the cave for shelter. In recognition of its importance, the caverns were designated a National Natural Landmark in 1971 and added to the National Register of Historic Places in 2004.


ADDC Convention Field Trip to the Natural Bridge Caverns continued

Today, Natural Bridge Caverns is more than just a cave tour. Visitors can enjoy aboveground activities such as zip lines, ropes courses, and gem panning. The site also hosts concerts in its underground Ballroom, making it the deepest performance venue in Texas. Exploration continues, with new passages still being discovered, confirming its status as the most actively explored cave system in the state.





Wishing you a season full of warmth, reflection, and continued inspiration.




