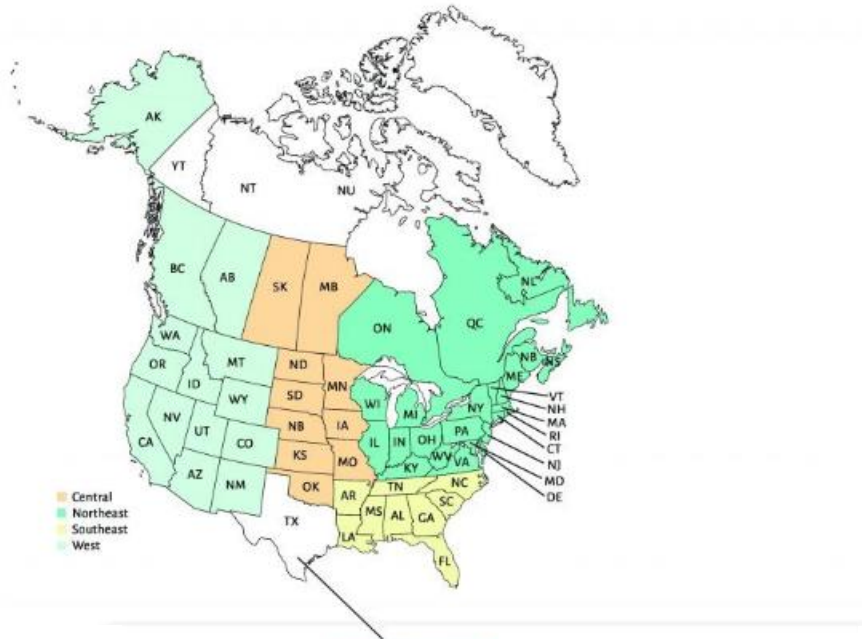

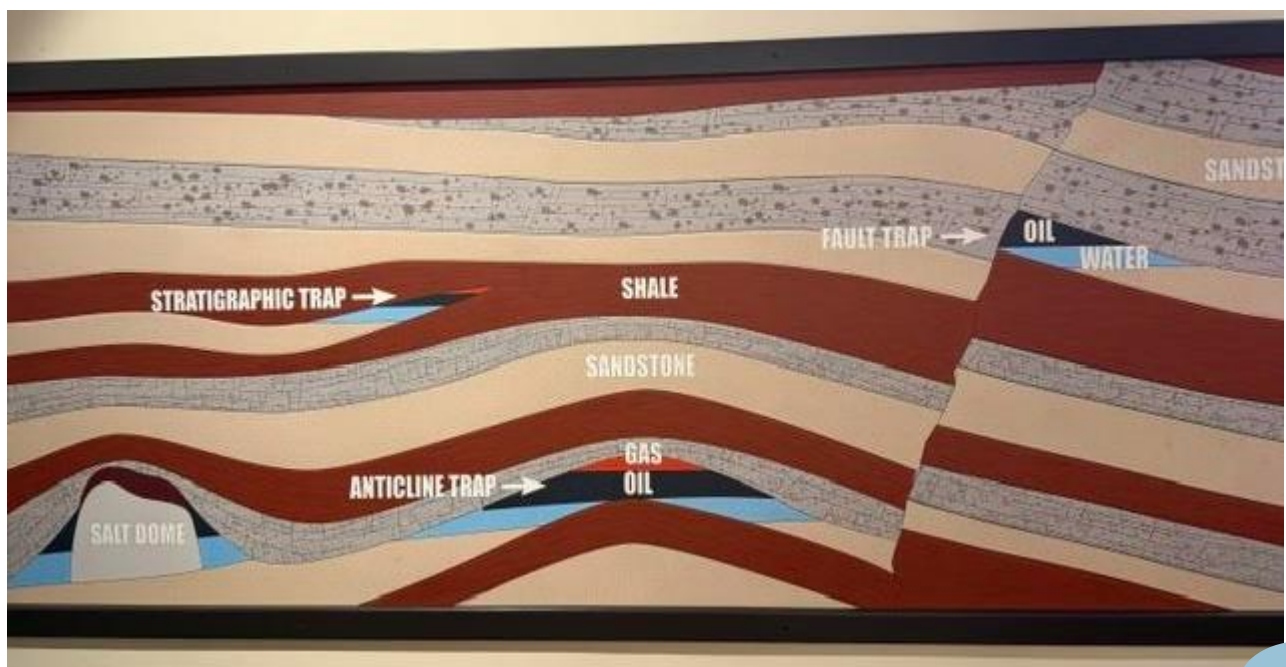

## Prud'homme Wells, 1823

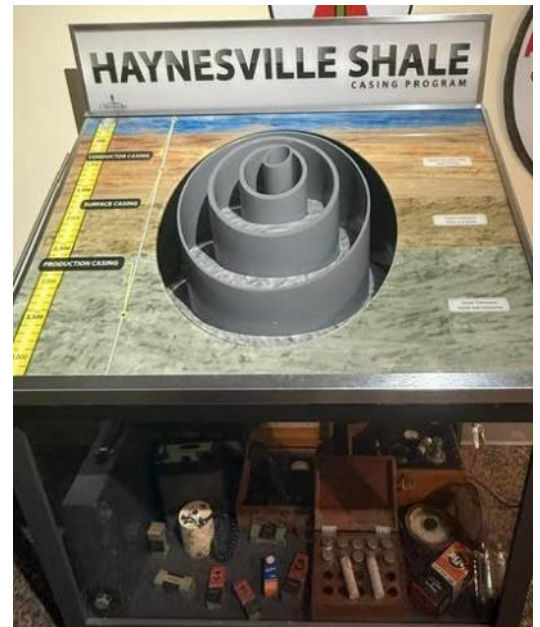
Early petroleum discoveries sometimes happened by accident. In 1823, three water wells were drilled on the Prud'homme family's Oakland Plantation (near Natchitoches). A visiting French engineer suggested that the wells be bored and not dug by hand. He designed tools to be rotated by solid iron drill stem or rods. Plans were drawn up and an enslaved blacksmith built the unusual tools. Slaves then constructed a large wooden derrick with three support legs to hoist the drilling equipment. The engineer's design resembled the oil drilling equipment used eighty years later in some of Louisiana's first petroleum fields.

Natural gas was encountered in each of the 4,400 ft. deep wells. Although the gas would burn, the wells were abandoned because no one knew how to use it as a fuel.



### Salute to the Oil Man

For over one hundred years, the petroleum industry has shaped the economy and culture of Louisiana. Oilmen were the driving force behind the success of the oil and gas industry. Each new discovery and innovation required skilled and dedicated workers to make it successful. To those men and women, and their families, we owe our gratitude for the improved quality of life they provided us.

## March Review

### Gas Pump Safety

Mr. Kevin Moore, HSE with Fleaux Services was our guest speaker for March. Mr. Moore is also one of Red River Desk and Derrick's Advisors and we always look forward to hearing him speak to us.

These are several great tips he shared for safety while you are filling up your vehicle.

- Always turn off your vehicle when you are fueling.
- Refrain from smoking or lighting a flame when you are at the gas station.
- Stay close by while filling up. Getting into your vehicle and then touching the pump could result in static charge. If you must get into your vehicle when fueling, touch the exterior metal of your vehicle before you grab the pump-doing so will help discharge any static charge you may have picked up.
- Pay attention to what you are doing. It is never a good idea to play games or talk on your phone when gallons of a highly flammable substance are flowing into your vehicle.
- Use approved gas containers-and use them the right way.
- Resist the urge to top off your tank with extra gas-doing so could cause a dangerous spill.
- Give your hands a good wash when you are through fueling.
- Leave the area immediately and call for help if a fire starts. Do not try to remove the nozzle or cut off the gas before you leave.

Filling up the tank is something most people do regularly, by keeping these tips in mind, you can help ensure you stay safe each time you do.

## **April Speaker Review**

### **History of Caddo Lake 2026**

Oil City began as a small railroad stop along the Kansas City Southern Railway Line that passed through the area in 1895. At the time, the town was known as Ananias, a name reportedly given by men from Shreveport who owned a hunting and fishing club on nearby Caddo Lake. Several nearby railroad stops, including Surrey and Caddo City, would eventually be absorbed into what became Oil City. Before Oil was discovered, most settlers made their living as fishermen, trappers, farmers, and timber workers. As oil production increased, the town of Oil City, Louisiana, grew rapidly. Workers, engineers, and their families moved into the region in large numbers. Businesses opened to support the growing population, and infrastructure expanded to meet industrial demand. Railroads, housing, and support industries reshaped the local economy and landscape. Although the boom years did not last forever, the impact of the whole development remained. Today, the Louisiana State Oil and Gas Museum preserves this history and explains how Caddo Lake influenced the growth of the oil industry.

In 1911, Caddo Lake entered American industrial history. The Gulf Refining Company drilled very like number one, which is widely considered the first true overwater oil well in the United States. Instead of drilling from land, crews worked from floating barges anchored directly on the lake. Pilings were driven deep into the lake bed to stabilize the equipment. From there, oil rigs reached thousands of feet below the surface in search of oil. The well was successful, producing hundreds of barrels of oil per day. More importantly, it proved that oil drilling could be done over open water. In 1914, the lake was dammed to raise water levels and make it easier to move heavy equipment across the surface. These methods helped shape techniques that would later be used in offshore oil drilling, including in oceans and deeper waters.

The boom town itself was rough and quickly built. Oil City had wooden sidewalks, muddy streets, and hitching posts for horses. For a time, even the town's main hotel was just a large tent. A single store served multiple purposes. It acted as a general store, a billboard hall, and even sometimes an auditorium. The passenger station, freight depot, and telegraph office were all located inside converted railroad freight cars. Because of its wild atmosphere, Oil City became known as the first "wildcat town" in the Arctic Tex region. One of the most important developments of the boom came from Caddo Lake. In 1907, oil company employee J.B. McCann began tracing the flow of natural gas escaping from the lake's surface. Sometimes the gas was so strong that he could ignite it and follow the flames across the water to locate underground deposits. McCann eventually leased nearly 1,000 acres of lake property for Gulf Oil. Engineers soon began planning a new idea: drilling for oil directly over the water. To build these platforms, workers cut 140 cypress logs, used a barge to get them out onto the lake, and drove them deep into the lake bed to support wooden drilling structures.

## History of Caddo Lake 2026 continued

By 1910, the oil industry was booming. Land prices skyrocketed from 50 cents per acre to \$500 per acre in just one year. The town's population exploded to nearly 25,000 people, and nearly every acre of land had been leased for oil production. As the boom matured, the town slowly developed more permanent structures. Despite these challenges, the oil fields surrounding Oil City became one of the most productive in Louisiana history. Between 1905 and 1942, the Caddo Pine Island Field produced approximately 159,770,000 barrels of oil and more than 136 billion cubic feet of natural gas. More than a century later, the field still produces oil today, though at much smaller levels than during the boom years. The derricks may be fewer now, but the legacy of the Oil City oil boom remains one of the most important chapters in the early history of Louisiana's petroleum industry.

Today, Caddo Lake is best known for its natural beauty and recreational use. Visitors come to fish, kayak, boat, and explore the narrow waterways that wind through the cypress forest. Some of the bald cypress trees here are more than 500 years old. They were standing long before steamboats arrived and long before oil rigs were built on the water. Caddo Lake helped shape American industry during a critical moment in history. At the same time, it remains a place of quiet and reflection. Beneath the water lies a story of change, innovation, and lasting impact, a reminder that even the calmest places can play a role in shaping the world.
