Pro Football Hall of Fame & Amish Country

Here are a few fun facts about the Pro Football Hall of Fame. It opened to the public on September 7, 1963, and honors standout contributors to professional football, including players, coaches, officials, owners, and front-office leaders. Although many inductees are best known for their NFL careers, the Hall of Fame is not officially affiliated with the NFL. As of 2026, it includes 382 members, with four to nine new inductees typically enshrined each year. The Chicago Bears have the most Hall of Fame members of any franchise, with 37 total honorees and 32 whose primary contributions were with the team.

Shawn Toy and Mandolyn Newell of the Ohio Natural Energy Institute (ONEi) travel across Ohio to help students, educators, and community members better understand the importance of natural gas and oil and the role these resources play in everyday life. This seminar brings their educational outreach and industry knowledge directly to convention attendees.

Shawn and her team help students understand where natural gas and oil come from, how these resources are produced, the careers connected to the industry, and the importance of the more than 6,000 products used in daily life that rely on energy resources. Shawn also oversees ONEi's scholarship and teacher workshop programs.

She serves on multiple business advisory councils across Ohio, including welding programs with Columbus City Schools and C-TEC in Licking County. She and her husband, married for 37 years, live in Licking County and enjoy spending time with their two sons and camping with their grandchildren.

Mandolyn Newell serves on ONEi's Education and Workforce Development team, where she educates the public and helps connect the future workforce to meaningful, high-demand careers in energy. Over the past seven years, she has helped tens of thousands of students, educators, and community members better understand the essential role energy plays in everyday life.

She began her career in midstream manufacturing of natural gas compressors before continuing her education in Science, Engineering, and Public Interest at The Ohio State University, along with studies in hydrocarbon formation in the Bahamas. She later earned a bachelor's degree in Sociology from Franklin University, presented *Empowering the Next Generation* at SHALE INSIGHT, and recently completed her Master of Public Administration.

Mandolyn currently serves as President-Elect of Women's Energy Network Ohio, chairs a global student programs task force, and contributes to education and workforce initiatives through Young Leaders of Licking County. Outside of work, she is a divemaster-in-training and mentors the next generation through philanthropy and community service, and jokes that her most important stakeholder (or boss) is her four-year-old daughter, Ellie Mae.

LDAR – An Interactive Experience

Erica oversees Range's industry-leading LDAR program, which includes inspections at all company locations eight times annually. In 2025 alone, the program completed more than 2,500 surveys and inspected over 11 million components. She also leads Range's methane quantification initiatives, helping advance the company's efforts in methane mitigation and emissions management.

The Life Cycle of a Well with In-Depth Environmental Practices is an engaging and interactive seminar designed to provide participants with a comprehensive understanding of the various stages involved in the development, operation, and reclamation of an unconventional natural gas well site.

This seminar walks participants through each phase of a well's life cycle beginning with site selection, permitting, and pre-construction planning. Discussion will include environmental assessments, erosion and sedimentation controls, stormwater management planning, and the importance of protecting nearby communities, waterways, and sensitive habitats before any ground disturbance occurs, how environmental specialists work alongside engineers and field personnel to ensure compliance with local, state, and federal regulations during every stage of development.

Participants will be introduced to common environmental field equipment used by professionals and inspectors. Demonstrations may include a soil probe for sampling, water conductivity and pH meters for water quality testing, and gas leak detection tools for monitoring emissions from equipment and infrastructure. These hands-on examples connect theory to real-world practice and show how environmental data is collected and interpreted in the field.

This seminar blends technical education, visuals, and demonstrations into a practical learning experience. Participants will leave with a stronger understanding of the natural gas development process and the environmental practices and technologies used to develop energy resources responsibly.

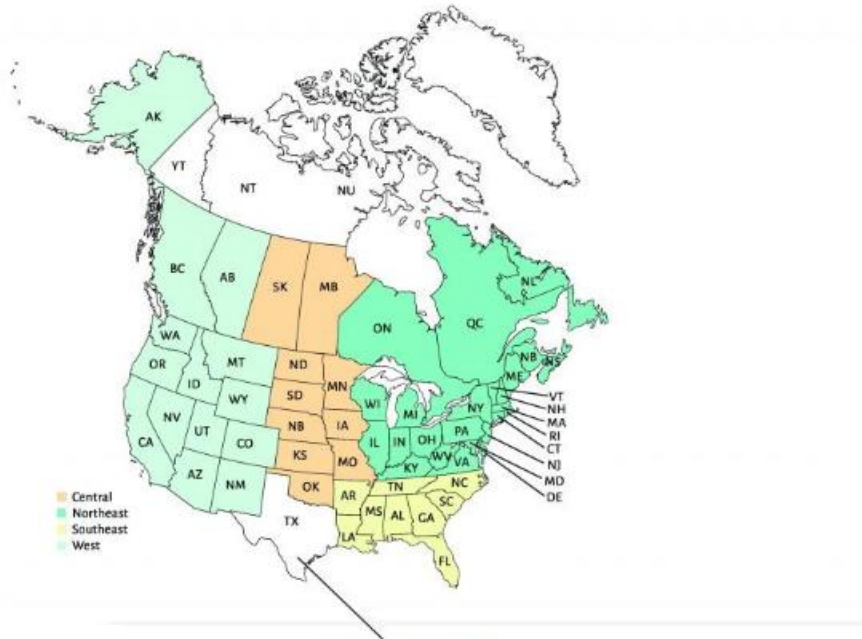

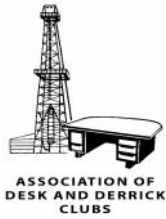
